Team Tanzie - together, we can #savebosnianstrays! Paw-PUMP!



Mona's Rehoming

\$564 Thank you to all those who helped fund former Bosnian rescue Mona's trip from her fist home in Fife, Scotland, to a rescue organization in Norfolk, England! Unfortunately her owner could no



longer keep Mona due to her increasing behavioral issues and unforeseen circumstances in the owner's personal life.

Thankfully this rescue organization gave her a chance at a new life - even giving her the "spa treatment" after arriving! Mona was still a bit nervous with the rescue, but soon began feeling more comfortable wandering around (she stopped darting to hide

under beds like she used to)! Although no one likes having to be rehomed, we're so grateful Mona's first family in Scotland took her out of Bosnia in the first place!

Giving Tuesday "Goodie-Bags!"

For #GivingTuesday 2022, we set out to make 25 "goodie" boxes" for Bosnian shelter dogs living with our friends at Animals We Care Mostar. A \$25 donation would purchase enough food, treats, and medications to fill a "goodie box" for one dog this holiday season!

Our goal was to raise \$625 to fill 25 boxes! Well, thanks to our pawesome "suppawters," we surpassed our goal of \$625/25 "goodie boxes" by \$125/5 boxes!! 30 shelter doggies in Mostar, Bosnia were pawsitively thrilled for the holiday season, all thanks to YOU, #teamtanzie!!

Bosnian rescues Tanzie, Rex, and Bella had quite a meet-up at the University of Virginia (UVA) in October, 2022, after their mommies realized their connection extended beyond their love of dogs and link to Bosnia, but also to UVA!

Nevena, mom to Rex (rescued in 2019 from Mostar), and Jelena, new mom to Bella (rescued in 2022, also from Mostar) are not just sisters - they're identical twins! And, not only are they originally from Mostar just like their fur-babies, they are both Virginia "Cavaliers" - graduating from UVA (class of '02), just like Tanzie's mom (class of '08)!

Jelena and Nevena have quite an amazing story of their family's relocation to Richmond,

Virginia, during the Bosnian war, and their time at UVA together (with their older sister there also attending during the same time!). To celebrate their journey and reflect on their time at UVA, the twins make an annual fall trip to visit the grounds.

Even though Katie and Nevena have known each other since Rex's 2019 rescue, they never realized their UVA connection until this fall during normal "pupdate" chats with Jelena about Rex and Bella. After the discovery, Tanzie immediately requested to crash the sisters' annual UVA reunion "pawty."



Thanks to the serendipitous interconnectedness of different life paths spanning decades, three former Bosnian street dogs and their moms (two of which also hail from the same Bosnian city as their pets) gathered for playtime and photos in front of the iconic UVA Rotunda, united by complete chance (and furry paws)!

GONE BUT NOT FORGOTEN

Saying goodbye to our canine companions is one of the hardest things humans must experience. Three of our beloved Bosnian rescues crossed the rainbow bridge in 2022.

Ice, Lea, and Archie, you are dearly missed. We are so saddened that your lives were cut short. We hope you're all somewhere close by, still playing in snow, running on beaches, and hiking trails like the many remarkable Bosnian rescues before you.





Ce 2014/2015 - March 2022

We were all crushed to learn of Ice unexpectedly crossed the rainbow bridge in her sleep on March 5.

Anyone who's followed Tanzie for even a short time knows this pair - Blue and Ice, the Bosnian huskies. Ice was one of our original Bosnian rescues - Tanzie's mom Katie even met Ice when she was deployed in 2015, never expecting to actually see her again, let alone foster her with her partner-in-crime, Blue, for 3 months before finding the perfect family.

Ice was so loved, not just by her family, but Tanzie's followers, her rescuers in Bosnia, and everyone that met her. Ice and Blue frequented Tanzie's outreach events, always showing their "suppawt" for the cause!

Ice survived more hardship in her early years than she ever deserved. Her "furever" story began when our friend Nina first rescued her in 2015 after she was thrown in a ravine. Nina took excellent care of Ice until the beginning of October, 2016, when she and buddy Blue had the chance to fly to the U.S. with just a week's notice. Tanzie excitedly welcomed Blue and Ice to crash with her until they found the "pawfect" family 3 months later.

Archie 2018/2019 - April 2022


Archie unexpectedly crossed the rainbow bridge in April after having a fatal seizure. His family rushed him to the emergency vet, but efforts to save him were unsuccessful.

Archie was our first Bosnian rescue in Spain and only began to know the joy of a furever home just 15 months before his fatal seizure. In that time, however, his family truly cherished him, taking him on all kinds of adventures and spoiling him rotten.

Before his frequent beach and hiking trips, Archie's rescue story began when his mom, originally from Mostar, Bosnia, saw a photo of him online in May 2020. She immediately fell in love. He sure didn't look like the handsome pup we came to know - but she could see his special personality through his malnourished and scared demeanor.

Lea

2015/2016 - June 2022

Yet another devastating loss in 2022 was Bosnian rescue, Lea, who crossed the rainbow bridge in June. Her family said she had slowly been showing signs of illness over previous few months without a solid diagnosis.

Lea's furever story began in Jan. 2018 as part of our "30 Days to Save Strays" rescue campaign when our rescue partner, Nina, was forced to close her Sarajevo shelter. Lea was approximately 2-3 years old when she left Bosnia for the UK.

While she had some behavioral issues in the beginning, her foster family did not give up on her. After several months worth of positive improvements, they decided to adopt her in April 2018, making each day an adventure for them all full of camping trips, beach visits, and birthday parties.


10 2022 YEAR IN REVIEW

FINANCIAL REPORTS

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

ur work to #savebosnianstrays starts with supporting individuals and organizations in Bosnia who we call Rescue Partners (or should we say, "paw-tners)! We support rescuers in the Bosnian towns of Mostar, Tuzla, and Sarajevo.

This year you'll notice a net loss. This isn't because Tanzie doesn't know how to budget, but rather, she had extra money at the end of last year, which she used to pay for expenses this year!

Where Your Donations Go

TTP's two program areas are **Animal Rescue** and **Animal Welfare.**

Animal Rescue

Our Animal Rescue program area includes expenses related to placing animals in new homes. These are incurred with animal transports, such as airfare, ground transport services, passports, health certificates, travel supplies (leashes, harnesses, etc).

Animal Welfare

Animal Welfare includes expenses to keep animals safe until they are placed in new homes:

Food: Costs of dog food for animals at rescue partners' shelter or other private pensions. This includes food revenues and expenses directly related to the Fairy Dog Parent sponsorship program.

Veterinary Care: Includes both surgical and non-surgical expenses; whether for significant treatment or repair due to injury or illness; or routine vaccinations, medications, or treatments other than surgical.


Private Shelter Fees: fees paid to private shelters (pensions) to house animals until they are adopted.

Other Animal Welfare Costs: Includes expenses for animal supplies not related to food, veterinary, or transport expenses (potty pads, vitamins blankets, etc).

Non-Program Related Expenses

Admin Expenses: Costs of payment processing and bank fees; software/subscription services (accounting, marketing, website); postage; and related expenses.
